

Ideal for households who do not currently compost Before getting the foodcycler we had a large compost and sent very little food waste to the landfill so this aspect has not changed.






It is reducing my organic waste by approx 2 lbs with each use It is leaving me with a produce I can put to use in my own garden





NOISE / SMELL / FUNCTION

What are your initial thoughts of the FoodCycler? How effective is it in reducing food waste going to the landfill?

Noise/Smell/Function

A marriage of foodcycler use and curbside pick up would be ideal if you are unable to personally compost the dried product Households could use the cycler to reduce the size, smell and unstable nature of fresh food and then have monthly pickup to a compost facility.



The unit does work well but a larger bucket would be more efficient. It is too noisy and smelly (it gives off a lot of moisture so placing it in a cabinet is not a good idea) so we have it on our covered porch and we will put it in the garage during the winter months.



Also to keep this in your kitchen is not feasible. There is a distinct smell (not offensive) but still not what you want your house to smell like Odor will be a decisive factor for purchasing



It is to small We are a family of three and we use it everyday if not multiple times a day



The lid needs a better handle. It is too small and hard to brag ahold of In order for the user to use the product it needs to be user friendly. Men especially will have a hard time with the lid.



The lid could use a redesign. It's very heavy and hard to grip, especially with wet hands. Anyone with arthritis or lack of hand strength would struggle with it.





It also takes up counter space in the kitchen Most homes do not have the luxury of having enough counter space to give up to another kitchen appliance





Our bucket has been damaged We haven't put anything other than vegetable and fruit waste into the machine, but some of the grey paint in the bucket has come off.



The development of noises and odors made it less appealing to use to the point where we have moved it outside. It took less than 2 months of daily use before our FoodCycler started to produce odors and also started making annoying noises.



Our filters didn't last 3 months Our cycle started to smell after about 2.5 months



Comment

Thank you for this comment. According to FoodCycle Science, the filters life will vary depending on what you put in your bucket and amount you use the unit. They did recommend adding a bit of citrus such as lime, lemon or orange to the buckets once in a while. This can help with potential smells.

It's quite loud but we just run it during the day instead of at night now



The FoodCycler can be quite noisy It can be quite disruptive, and have had to pause a cycle or two so we aren't disturbed



END PRODUCT (SOIL AMENDMENT)

What are your initial thoughts of the FoodCycler? How effective is it in reducing food waste going to the landfill? End Product (Soil Amendment)

I put the soil amendment in my beds and left it sit for a few days. No critters! No smell. And I put meat and dairy in my foodcycler. I love it!





It is a benefit to us that we have natural compost for our garden. There is less need for us to purchase commercial products to keep our garden healthy.





Love it, really making our compost useable for the garden much sooner than before! Help reduce waste for some people who didn't compost before





Curious to see results in garden soil and growth It's too early to tell what the effects of directly mixing the dried/reduced waste right in the soil will be. So far so good!





We thought that this was a good idea as we have recycled in a compost for years and this has worked well for us. we have added the product to our top soil that we make for our vegie garden but used a much smaller ratio than suggested and so far our garden is doing very well, our plan is to continue





Great product to convert compost into a small handful of dirt! Not only minimizes waste but reduces and changes compost into dirt that can be directly used without filling up the outdoor bin.





People have reported problems using the FoodCycler "product": mould, animals, clumpy compost. In order for the FoodCycler to be attractive, we need clear guidelines on how the residue can be used without hassle.





I worry that benefits of product to plants will be less than my previous system. Worry is not big enough to not do it.





Waste amount reduced - but I don't have a use for the byproduct Byproduct sitting in a huge container on my deck - don't garden so don't have any use for it/place to put it



I don't currently have a garden to use the end product in so I'm not sure how I feel about the soil amendment. Seems like it may be a lot of effort and trial and error to get it working well.



WILDLIFE ATTRACTANT

Wildlife Attractant

We live in a rural area where bears will visit an outside compost pile if we had one. The FoodCycler eliminates this worry.





It doesn't smell- or at least what we process does not have much if any odour It is not attracting any animals into my yard/garden





No smell and is not an attractant for wildlife. Eliminates varmints!





Did not seem to attract dogs and critters to the garden That being said, I did not add meat or dairy to the bucket for fear of attracting the rats and dogs!



I worry the end product could attract rats....but then, I think any manure or compost might do that.





Using the FoodCycler for meat waste is probably not a good idea with the current rat situation. We noticed batches of processed food that included meat waste had more of a smell that would likely attract critters.





The compost still smells We have used it in our garden and found plants have been dug up to get at the compost.



If this creates a good garden soil enhancer that does not attract animals to my yard then I'll likely always use a process like this. Ease of use compared to traditional composting methods and the resulting product is easy to store.

I am so happy that I am reducing GhGs - I know there is a cost for the filters, but the unit is cheap to use for electricity. The money we are saving on garbage tags (\$1.75 a bag) will cover my filters.



How long will the foodcycler last? I am worried that if the product lifespan is only a few years we are left with tonnes of electronic waste instead of food waste



Waste amount reduced - but at what cost? Environmentally & utilities-wise? We are a family of 3 that cooks a lot and has to run the machine 2 to 3 times a day!?!?!



Comment

Thank you for your thought! These are good questions. As far as utilities go, these units use very little electricity and cost approximately 8 cents to run one bucket. And as Nelson Hydro customers, we have clean green energy.

I'm still on the fence/unsure! I appreciate finally having a composting solution that doesn't endanger wildlife or attract pests, but I'm concerned about the carbon footprint!

Initially receiving the boxed machine I was super excited and as unpacked the machine I couldn't help but feel a pang of regret. What is the true cost of extracting, producing, shipping and then disposing of this plastic/electronic machine? Better than landfilling organics?
